Daley Middle School located at 150 Fleming St., Lowell, MA 01851 which describes and explains the following deficiencies and the priority category(s) for which an application may be submitted to the Massachusetts School Building Authority in the future under Priority 5 Replacement, renovation or modernization of school facility systems, such as roofs, windows, boilers, heating and ventilation systems, to increase energy conservation and decrease energy related costs in a school facility; specifically pertaining to failures in the roofing system and two boilers which are past their working life; and hereby further specifically acknowledges that by submitting this Statement of Interest Form, the Massachusetts School Building Authority in no way guarantees the acceptance or the approval of an application, the awarding of a grant or any other funding commitment from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, or commits the City/Town/Regional School District to filing an application for funding with the Massachusetts School Building Authority.

SUBJECT: Statement of Interest – Daley School

As you are aware, the City of Lowell is in the process of preparing applications for the Massachusetts Building Authority's (MSBA) Accelerated Repair Program (ARP), which aims to ease the financial burden of repairing or replacing large building systems which have gone beyond their useful life, including roofs, boilers, windows and doors. Part of the requirement of the application is a vote by the governing body of the municipality to take a vote to support the Superintendent of Schools to submit a Statement of Interest, which serves as the starting point for a possible invitation into the program. As such, I am recommending the following vote take place with regards to the Daley School, **which has a roof and two boilers that are beyond their useful working life.**

Vote No. 2 – Daley Middle School
