Detectors

Ionization detectors contain a minute amount of radioactive material. Although this amount is too small to threaten human health it is not allowed in municipal waste. These detectors should be returned to manufacturer for safe disposal. Visit LowellRecycle.org » **Detectors**

Photoelectric detectors, like carbon monoxide can be disposed of in trash. Make sure to remove battery (9 volt) from back and any recyclable metal casing then put detector in normal trash bin.

Fire Extinguisher

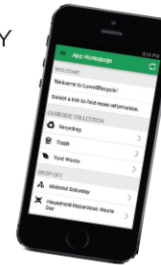
