Dear Applicant,

This letter is being sent out along with the release of the FY 2020-21 RFP for Federal funds.

The CDBG Public Service Cap allocation process will be revised under the 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan and this will affect the guidelines for grant sub-recipients. This change is part of the City's new allocation plan and will run concurrent with the yearly RFP process.

The 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan award amounts under the Public Service Cap will range between \$15,000.00 and \$20,000.00 with a maximum of two applications submitted per organization. Under limited absolute need there may be an award of up to \$50,000.00, and this will be determined by the Department of Planning Development.

Applications for Public Service projects that meet HUD's criteria as outlined in the CDBG regulations, 24 CFR 570.201, will be provided CDBG assistance for FY 2020-2021. Please note CDBG funds are not intended to sustain a program for an indefinite period of time.

Applications for ESG funds will now be reviewed by an internal committee based on the recommendations of the City Manager's Task Force on Homelessness and Sustainable Housing.
