Is my home in a Historic District? The Historic Board oversees 10 historic districts in Lowell, which are recognized by the State and National Register of Historic Places. If your home is within the Andover Street Historic District, Belvidere Hill Historic District, Rogers Fort Hill Park Historic District, South Common Historic District, Tyler Park Historic District, Wannalancit Street Historic District, Washington Square Historic District or the Wilder Street Historic District you are eligible for a historic house marker. Don't know if your home is within a district? Call us!

What do they look like? Made of aluminum, the markers are approximately 12" x 18" with dark green background and cream graphics. The date the home was built and the name of the original owner (if known) both appear on the marker. Historic Board staff will be glad to assist in selecting the best location for installation.



How do I order one? Complete, clip, and mail the form below and enclose a check for \$70 payable to The Lowell Historic Board that will cover the cost of producing the marker. You will be contacted when the marker is completed (approximately four weeks, although times may vary) and delivery, pick-up, and installation can be arranged. Mail to:
