The 911 Training grand funding supports costs associated with a maximum of twenty-four (24) hours of continuing education for its certified 911 telecommunicators.

SUBJECT: State 911 Department Grant Awards

The Lowell Police Department is excited to notify you of three state grant awards recently received from the State 911 Department. The first is the FY 2024 Support and Incentive award in the amount of \$540,496 over a one year period. This grant enables the Department to cover a portion of salary costs for certified 911 telecommunicators and to purchase equipment for the dispatch center.

The second is the FY 2024 Training grant award in the amount of \$63,174 over a one year period. This funding supports costs associated with continuing education for LPD certified 911 telecommunicators. Due to the department's call volume, LPD dispatchers were eligible for additional training and will complete twenty-four (24) hours of training during fiscal year 2024.

The third is the FY 2024 Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) grant award in the amount of \$643.23 over a one year period. This funding will be used to purchase an Annual Software Maintenance Support system.
