ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Amending "The Code of Ordinances City of Lowell, Massachusetts" With Respect to Chapter 150 thereof Entitled, "Fees" by amending certain sections.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOWELL, as follows:

"The Code for the City of Lowell," hereinafter called the "Code", adopted by the City Council on December 23, 2008, is hereby amended with respect to 150 thereof, by amending certain sections:

1. By amending Chapter 150, Entitled **Fees; Parking Department** by replacing number 2 and 3, and by adding new numbers 4-14 as follows:

2. All provisions of the Lowell City Code, as amended, which are consistent with this Ordinance, shall continue in effect, but all provisions of said Code inconsistent herewith, are repealed.
3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 43 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

Dear Mayor Rourke and Members of the Lowell City Council,

I am hereby requesting the council vote to amend the city's ordinances related to the Parking Enterprise Fund rate fees. These proposed ordinances, if amended, will allow for much needed additional revenue in the Parking Enterprise Fund by increasing rates along with generating new fees. Since my administration began, a Parking Enterprise Fund rate amendment has been discussed with the City Council as a whole and through several subcommittee meetings. Through these discussions, the Parking Director has worked in conjunction with my Finance Team and the Law Department to carefully draft these new fees to not overly burden the taxpayers. During our last public hearing regarding these amendments, suggestions were brought forth by the residents and the City Council. This proposed ordinance reflects these changes by combining the residential parking permits into one fee, for both driveways and non-driveways residents, as well as accomplishing the same for elderly residents. This change is reflected for both the first-time users as well as our annual users. I have asked the Law Department to prepare this ordinance with these amended sections.
