ORDER

Pursuant to Chapter 266 of the Code of Ordinances City of Lowell, Massachusetts, concerning Section 266-6 thereof entitled "Temporary Experimental Regulations", temporary traffic regulations are hereby implemented for a period of sixty (60) days.

The City of Lowell desires to make temporary rules regulating traffic under actual conditions for a period of sixty (60) days; and

Chapter 266 of the Code of Ordinances City of Lowell, Massachusetts", Section 266-6 thereof entitled "Temporary Experimental Regulations" authorizes the City Council to make such temporary rules for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days;

BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the City Council of the City of Lowell as follows:

Effective immediately for a period of sixty (60) days thereafter, the following temporary traffic regulations shall be implemented:

§266-44

One-way streets designated is hereby amended by **removing** the following

Name of Street
Perry Street

Location
From Sherman Street to Rogers Street.

§266-56

Parking prohibited on certain streets at all times
is hereby amended by **adding** the following:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Perry Street	West	Beginning at the westerly curblineline of Rogers Street and running northerly for a distance of 400 feet.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED 60 DAY TRIAL TRAFFIC ORDERS

DATE: November 6, 2018

Attached are the 60-day trial traffic orders for this week as follows:

- One-way Designation – removed per citizen request on Perry Street – The purpose of the one-way designation was to alleviate a safety concern due to the street width. The trial resulted in numerous complaints received from business owners about impacts to delivery and customer circulation. Given that the street is too narrow to accommodate two lanes of parking and two-directional traffic, especially in the winter when the snow will make the road narrower, a no-parking restriction will go into effect in front of the condominiums. The condominium development was approved without a street parking restriction, but Perry Street residents were assured that they would not be impacted due to the availability of 3 parking spaces per unit behind the condominiums.
- No Parking – Per citizen request on Perry Street
