Frontline vehicles are necessary to carry out the mission of the department, being used proactively as a crime deterrent, and responding to emergency incidents timely. During the COVID-19 pandemic, there was an overall increase in crime across the country. Lowell was no different.
Brief description of recipient's approach to ensuring that response is reasonable and proportional to a public health or negative economic impact of Covid-19	Much of Lowell resides within Qualified Census Tracts, which were disproportionately impacted by the effects of the pandemic. Without reliable frontline cruisers, the effectiveness of the department's public safety mission is greatly reduced. Four new vehicles will have a substantial impact on the mission, allowing us to be more responsive to the needs of Lowell's 115,000+ residents.
