

GARDEN AND SHED

Leaves & Small Branches†

Yard Waste is scheduled for normal curbside collection March through September. Put these items in a paper yard waste bag or bin and place waste at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.



Snow Blowers & Lawn Mowers

Small engine machines such as lawn mowers and snow blowers should be disposed of through Lowell's bulky item collection. Bulky item collections are scheduled by **appointment only**, and **require payment** over the phone.

Note: Any left over diesel, engine oil etc. must be emptied with cap off. Then place bulky item at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.

Diesel, engine oil etc. can be disposed of through Lowell's House Hazardous Waste drop-off event.

Pesticides, Herbicides & Fertilizers†

Residents can dispose of **hazardous waste** through Lowell's Household Hazardous Waste drop-off event.

What is Hazardous Waste?

- Flea & Tick Powders

- Insecticides
- No-Pest Strips and Pesticides

Garden Tools

Garden and construction tools can be placed in regular disposal bin and are subject to pick up on scheduled collection day. **Tools in good condition should be donated or reused.**

MISCELLANEOUS

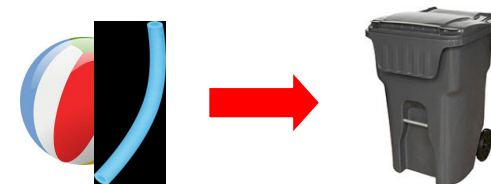
Lawn Decorations

Broken/ old large inflatable or plastic lawn figurines can be placed in regular trash bin. Broken smaller figurines may also be put in trash bin. Consider **donating or selling** decorations in good condition.

Pool Items

- Pool Toys

Pool toys can be disposed in regular trash bins and set out by 7a.m. on scheduled collection days.



- Pool Heater

Pool heaters fall under **bulky items collection**. Bulky item collections are scheduled by **appointment only**, and **require payment** over the phone. (see under snow blowers & lawn mowers)

- Pool chemicals/Chlorine

Chlorine, pool drains, cleaners etc. all fall under Hazardous Waste material. Drop-off items during Lowell's HHWD event.

Outdoor Recreational Items

The following items should be disposed of through Lowell's bulky item collection. Collections are by **appointment only** and **require** payment over the phone.

- Swing set/ Trampoline/ Bicycles

Grill and Propane Tank

Outdoor and camping grills may be disposed of through bulky item collection. For more information see above (outdoor recreational items). Gas grill collection requires a **fee** and does not include the propane tank.
